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## ANNUAL MEETING OF THE AFRICAN NETWORK OF ROAD SAFETY LEGISLATORS KAMPALA, 2-3 MAY 2023

### INTRODUCTION:

The Global Network for Road Safety Legislators was established in December 2016 to united the voices of parliamentarians globally to address road traffic deaths and injuries. We support the <u>United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety</u> and the <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u> target to halve road deaths and injuries by 2030. Parliamentarians can play a decisive role to help make our roads safe and stop the carnage that kills over 3500 people every day. The Global Network of Road Safety Legislators is led by a Leadership Council composed of parliamentarians representing WHO's six regions.

The African Regional Network for Road Safety Legislators was formed in Abuja, Nigeria in 2018. The goal of the African Network is to unite the voices of parliamentarians and parliamentary bodies in Africa in order to strengthen advocacy efforts aimed at accelerating action to reduce road traffic deaths and injuries globally.

WHO country office in Uganda and the Parliamentary Forum of Road Safety Legislators – Uganda, have agreed that the annual meeting of the Network of African Road Safety Legislators will be hosted in Kampala Uganda from 2-3 May 2023. Road safety management relies heavily on legislation primarily crafted by parliamentarians. When it comes to developing safety interventions through legislation, it's crucial to base them on scientific evidence and carefully evaluate their effectiveness, practicality, efficiency, and public acceptance. The proposed theme for this meeting is "Legislation and Road Safety".

The Parliamentary Forum on Road Safety – Uganda (PAFROS) was established in 2012 following a petition that was signed by 70 members of the Parliament of Uganda. Over the years from establishment, PAFROS has been active in the following ways:

- Submission and presentations of road safety petitions and motions.
- Worked closely with government ministries and agencies, international aid agencies, as well as civil society.
- Increased networking and engagement with other road safety legislators in Africa and beyond.
- Piloted the Legislative Action Plan for Road Safety in Uganda with support from the Global Road Safety Facility- World Bank Group.
- Engaged media and the general public.
- Supported the amendment of the Traffic and Road Safety Act.
- Supported the review and increased allocation of a budget for road safety.

### **OBJECTIVE:**

The Objective of this meeting/conference is to align legislative actions for the African Network of Road Safety Legislators in supporting the second Decade of Action for Road Safety 2021-2030 (DoA), which targets the reduction of road traffic deaths by 50% by 2030 and support the achievement of safer, efficient and sustainable transport; through:

- Advocating for full ratification and implementation of the African road safety charter
  whose main objectives are to serve as a policy framework for Road Safety improvement
  in Africa and to serve as an advocacy tool and instrument for Road Safety improvement
  on the Continent aimed at facilitating the creation of an enabling environment to
  drastically reduce the road traffic crashes.
- 2. Adopting mechanisms at legislator's disposal to hold themselves and their governments accountable to deliver on the SDGs, the DoA and the African Road Safety Charter.

Activities held over a two-day conference, will enhance and escalate concerted road safety efforts in Africa targeting regional road safety policy and ensuring the continued alignment of the road safety action plans in the African region to the International and Regional targets over a period of 5 years (2023-2028), as well as the commitment to implement these action plans.

#### EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

#### Immediate outcomes:

- 1. Identify mechanisms at MP's disposal to contribute to the achievement of SDGs and reduction of RT deaths by half by 2030.
- Identify action needed from Member States that have not yet ratified the African Road Safety Charter and discuss progress and challenges for those countries that have ratified the charter
- 3. Identify action needed from Member States that have not yet acceded to the UN Transport Conventions
- To agree a three-year road map for African legislators prioritising the following areas of road safety legislation including resource mapping (priority and justification of priority will be key to the road maps)
  - i. Vehicle Standards
  - ii. Risk factors such as driving under the Influence of drugs and alcohol, Speeding, Seat belts and Helmet wearing.
  - iii. Road Safety Audits and Inspections

### Intermediate Outcomes:

- Accession to the AU Road Safety Charter by 15 countries within an agreed timeline
- ii. Accession to the UN Road Safety Conventions for a target number of countries within an agreed timeline
